



- (6) The study involved more than 200,000 participants. People who signed up to participate who already had cardiovascular disease or cancer were excluded.
- (7) The participants provided information about their health every two to four years, and completed food frequency questionnaires (FFQ) every four years. With the FFQ, the participants reported how often they consumed specific foods over the past year, which the researchers used to determine their daily ratio of plant-to-animal protein intake.
- (8) By the end of the 30-year study, it was found that participants with higher plant-to-animal protein ratios showed a significantly reduced risk of cardiovascular disease compared to **those** who had the lowest plant-to-animal protein ratio they had a 19% lower risk. The reduced risk for coronary heart disease was even more impressive at a 27% lower risk.


